

Maryland, sub-title "Liquor and Intoxicating Drinks," as the same now stands and to re-enact the same with amendments, and to add an additional section thereto, to be designated and known as section 676A.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That sections 674 and 682 of article 4, entitled "City of Baltimore," of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, sub-title "Liquor and Intoxicating Drinks," as the same now stands, be and the same are hereby repealed and re-enacted with amendments, and that an additional section, to be designated and known as section 676A, be added to said article 4, said section so amended and added to read as follows:

674. Said petition shall contain the name and residence of the applicant, and how long he has resided there; (2) the particular place for which a license is desired, designating the same by street and number, if practicable, and, if not, by such other apt description as definitely locates it; (3) the kind of license desired, whether a saloon license, hotel license or retail grocer's license; (4) the name of the owner of the premises upon which the business licensed is to be carried on; (5) a statement that the applicant is a citizen of the United States, and that it is necessary for the accommodation of the public that the place should be licensed; (6) that the applicants have not, or has any of them, had a license for the sale of intoxicating liquors in this State revoked, nor has been convicted of any crime within one year preceding the filing of said petition; (7) that he or she will not knowingly sell, or allow to be sold in the said house or on the said premises any such liquor on Sunday or on election days, or to minors at any time, or allow a minor to drink in said house or on said premises; that he or she will not keep or permit to be kept a bawdy house in the said house or on said premises, or the gathering together or the visitation to said house or premises of women for lewd or immoral purposes; (8) this petition must be verified by the affidavit of the petitioner, made before a justice of the peace; if any false statement is made in any part of said petition, the petitioner shall be deemed guilty of perjury, and upon indictment and conviction thereof, his license shall be revoked, and he shall be subject to the penalties provided by law for that crime.

676A. Any club, society or association whatever, whether incorporated or not, now in existence or hereafter to be formed, desiring to sell or furnish intoxicating liquors to its members or guests, in order to do so shall first obtain a club license from the said board upon its application therefor to be made by a
