One of such plates or markers shall be displayed conspicuously on the front and the other on the rear of such motor vehicle, both to be fastened so as not to swing. Every motorcycle or bicycle with motor attachment while being used or operated in this State shall have displayed on the rear thereof a plate or marker furnished by the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles as aforesaid, said plate or marker to be so fastened as to be entirely unobscured and to be kept reasonably clean, and fastened so as not to swing.

No motor vehicle while used or operated in this State shall have displayed upon either the front or the rear of such vehicle more than two plates or markers, nor shall any person display or permit to be displayed upon any motor vehicle operated in this State the registration number belonging to another vehicle, or a fictitious number plate or marker, provided, however, in the event of the sale of a motor vehicle, the person using the same may, for a period of five days, and no longer, operate such motor vehicle under the number assigned to it as aforesaid, provided he shall have and display on the demand of any proper officer the actual consent in writing of such previous owner to use such number; and provided also that where it clearly appears that the registration number has been lost, by accident, no penalty shall be imposed.

Any person violating any provision of this section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction, subject to a fine of not less than five dollars (\$5.00) nor more than fifty dollars (\$50.00) for the first offense.

BRAKES, BELLS, LIGHTS AND MUFFLERS.

- 148. (1) Brakes. Every motor vehicle, while in use on the public highways of this State, shall be provided with adequate brakes.
- (2) Horns. Every such motor vehicle shall be equipped with a suitable bell, horn or other signalling device producing an abrupt sound sufficiently loud to serve as an adequate warning of danger, but no person operating any motor vehicle shall
