

shall not be required to appear before the said Board of Supervisors of Election for the purpose of examination nor to be sworn in as required by Section 9 of this Article, but the said Boards of Supervisors of Election for the several counties, before making appointments of any such judges or clerks, shall thoroughly inform themselves as to the qualifications of the parties appointed, and shall not require their attendance before the said board for such examination, and they shall appoint only such persons as are known to them to possess the proper qualifications for the position to which they are severally appointed, and the said persons may be sworn in either by said board or by a justice of the peace or notary public of the said county, and when sworn in by a justice of the peace or notary public, such judges and clerks shall file with said board of supervisors a certificate of qualification.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall take effect from June 1st, 1918.

#### CHAPTER 121.

AN ACT to provide for the regulation, control and licensing of horse racing within Prince George's County; to create the Prince George's County Racing Commission, and prescribe its powers and duties; to provide license fees for the conduct of horse racing within said county; and to repeal Sections 219, 220 and 221 of Article 27 of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, 1914, title "Crimes and Punishments," sub-title "Gaming," so far as said sections apply to Prince George's County.

#### CHAPTER 122.

AN ACT to create a sanitary district within Montgomery and Prince George's Counties contiguous to the District of Columbia; to incorporate the same, and to provide for the government thereof; to provide for the construction, maintenance, operation, purchase or condemnation of water supply, sewerage and refuse disposal systems; to provide for the issuance of bonds for the purpose of such construction;
