

golf club grounds, country club grounds, hotel grounds, and country estates, shall pay or cause to be paid, either directly or indirectly to any superintendent, manager, gardener, foreman, or other employe, money or other consideration, whatsoever as a present, reward, inducement, bonus or commission on any bill of purchase, of the foregoing commodities which are to be used in the formation or maintenance of parks, grounds, and estates designated herein, and no superintendent, manager, gardener, foreman or other employee shall ask for, demand, exact, require, accept or receive, either directly or indirectly, from any person or corporation engaged in the business of building greenhouse structures, selling fertilizers, insecticides, coal, soil, flower pots, trees, shrubs, bulbs, plants, garden and farm implements, seeds or any other commodities necessary for the formation and maintenance of public parks or grounds, cemeteries, baseball or athletic grounds, golf club grounds, country club grounds, and country estates, any money or other consideration whatsoever on any bill for the purchase of any of the before said mentioned commodities.

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted*, That any person or corporation violating any of the provisions of this Act shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine not exceeding two hundred dollars, or by imprisonment in the county or city jail for a period not exceeding six months, or both, in the discretion of the Court.

SEC. 3. *And be it further enacted*, That any and all acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act shall be and the same are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SEC. 4. *And be it further enacted*, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1918.

CHAPTER 426.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Chapter 509 of the Acts of 1916, which repealed and re-enacted with amendments Section 3 of Article 10 of the Annotated Code of the Public Civil Laws of Maryland, regulating admission to the Bar.
