

so damaged by reason of the recent heavy truck hauling, etc., over it; that it has become impassable; and

WHEREAS, The said road is an important United States Mail route, and one of the most important highways for the intake and outlet of freight, merchandise and farm products, and, in fact, at the present time the only outlet for a large agricultural and business community; therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the State Roads Commission of Maryland, be, and it is, hereby authorized to take over, as part of the State road system the macadam road leading from the western end of the town of Cecilton in Cecil County through the town of Warwick to the Delaware State line, and hereafter maintain the same, as a part of said State road system, after the same has been put in repair by County Commissioners.

CHAPTER 428.

AN ACT to authorize and direct the Treasurer of the State of Maryland and the County Commissioners of Washington County to refund to Harry G. Traver a portion of the money paid by him for a license to sell spirituous and fermented liquors and lager beer.

Whereas Harry G. Traver on the 1st day of May, 1916, paid Edward Oswald, Clerk of the Circuit Court for Washington County, the sum of two hundred and fifty (\$250.00) dollars for a license to sell spirituous and fermented liquors and lager beer in Sandy Hook District, Washington County, Maryland, from the first day of May, 1916, to the first day of May, 1917, which said sum of two hundred and fifty (\$250.00) dollars was paid by the said Edward Oswald in accordance with the provisions of the Acts of 1908, Chapter 380, one-fourth thereof, sixty-two dollars and fifty cents (\$62.50), to the Treasurer of Maryland, and three-fourths thereof, or one hundred and eighty-seven dollars and fifty cents (\$187.50), to the Tax Collector of Washington County;

Whereas by virtue of the provisions of an Act of Assembly of the year 1916, Chapter 145, the sale of spirituous and fermented liquors was made illegal and forbidden in said Sandy
