

to said Article seven sections under the sub-title "Plumbing," to be known as Sections 184, 185, 186, 187, 188, 189 and 190.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Article 43 of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland (Code of 1904), title "Health," be and the same is hereby amended by adding seven sections thereto under the sub-title "Plumbing," to be known as Sections 184, 185, 186, 187, 188, 189 and 190, and to read as follows:

PLUMBING.

184. It shall not be lawful for any person, firm or corporation to employ as workmen to do plumbing work in the State of Maryland any persons except those qualified to work at the plumbing business, as provided in this subdivision of this Article; and no person shall be qualified to work at the plumbing business in this State unless he has made application to and received from the State Board of Commissioners of Practical Plumbing the certificate of competence described in Section 186 of this Article and is otherwise qualified as required by this subdivision of this Article. Any person or firm engaged in the plumbing business in this State, and the superintendent, manager, agent or other officer of any corporation engaged in the plumbing business in this State, who shall employ any person to work at the plumbing business who is not qualified as required by this subdivision of this Article, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not less than ten dollars, nor more than fifty dollars, for every day or part of every day that such employer shall employ such workman. And any person or firm not engaged in the plumbing business in this State, and the superintendent, manager, agent or other officer of any corporation not engaged in the plumbing business in this State, who shall employ any person to do plumbing work in this State, knowing the person so employed is not qualified to work at the plumbing business as required by this subdivision of this Article, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not less than ten dollars, nor more than fifty dollars, for every day or part of every day that such employer shall so employ such workman.

If any person shall work at the plumbing business in this State without being qualified as required by this subdivision of this Article, he shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not less than five dollars, nor more than fifty dollars, for every day or every part of every day that such workman shall work at the plumbing business.
