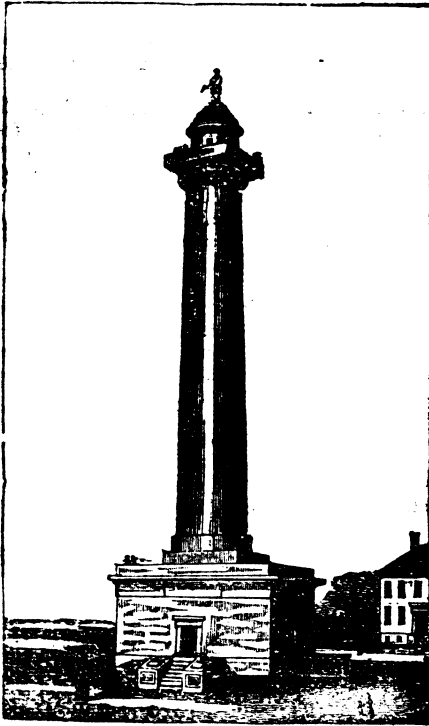


WASHINGTON MONUMENT.
