ounted to thirds per cent. In the year 1820, the population was 62,738; increase in ten years seventy-six and a quarter per cent. In 1830, the population was 80,622, increase in ten years twenty-eight and a half per cent. Average increase every ten years, for forty years, fifty-eight and three quarters per cent. Supposing the present population to be 100,000, the increase since the taking of the last census, (seven years,) would be twenty-one per cent; which is equal, in proportion, to thirty per cent in ten years.

In speaking of the *climate* of this city, and its unfavorable influence on the *blacks*, the reader must not suppose that the white inhabitants share this inconvenience. On the contrary, as it respects them, there is no American city more salubrious, as the weekly reports of our Board of Health are sufficient to testify.
