The Dunbar Theatre, operated by the Dunbar Amusement Corporation, with Mr. Josiah Diggs, President; and Mr. Walter W. Carr, Manager and Vice-President, is a monument to the industry, untiring energy, and faith in the people of Baltimore manifest by its President and founder.

Mr. Diggs opened his house, which was then a much smaller building, with a capacity of 350 people, back in 1917, and by the dint of continual effort and persistency "carried on" until in November, 1923, he was compelled to rebuild on the original site when he enlarged his theatre to a magnificent building, 75 x 100 feet, with a capacity of 1,000 people, making it the largest movie house for our people in Maryland.
