Educated in Buckingham County High School, Virginia, and La Salle Institute, Chicago, Illinois.

In 1922, Mr. Allen was appointed by Mayor Broening to the Zoning Commission—1927-30; served on the Baltimore and Federal Grand Jury. In 1925 he became the President of the Southern Life Insurance Company and is now serving his twelfth year in that capacity.

Mr. Allen has been the Grand Master of the State of Maryland since 1922 and is the Most Puissant Sovereign Grand Commander of the United Supreme Council, Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite of Freemasonry, Southern Jurisdiction.

He has varied interests. His altruistic spirit finds some expression in his activities as a member of the Association for the Handicapped, Inc., and as a member of the Board of Managers of the House of Reformation for Colored Boys at Cheltenham, Maryland. Mr. Allen is also an active member of the Republican Party. In 1934 Mr. Allen was a delegate to the State Republican Convention. He seconded the nomination to Senator France.
