1. Responsible for opening the sight-saving class at School No. 127, Biddle Street near Pennsylvania Avenue, April 23, 1930, with an enrollment of eighteen boys and girls.
2. Instrumental in raising money for pupil transportation to and from sight saving class until school board took over this responsibility. The money was then used as an eye glass fund, etc.

It was through the cooperation of Dr. J. W. Wallin, former Director of Physical Education, Dr. F. M. Wood, Parent-Teacher Associations, and public spirited citizens that the above things were made possible.
