Passed June 6, 1861. AN ACT appropriating a sum of money for the payment of the claims of John Murphy & Co., Andrew Henderson, Hugh McAlear, Adams & Co's. Express, Tyler Davis, Erasmus West, G. & L. Markell & Co., A. H. Hager, H. C. Shipley, Adolphus Fox, Quynn & Ritter and Edwin M. Shipley.

Authorised to pay. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the Treasurer on the warrant of the Comptroller be and he is hereby authorized and directed to pay to John Murphy & Co., ten hundred and sixty-eight dollars and seventy-five cents, for Stationery, &c., for use of State Library; to Andrew Henderson, twenty dollars and sixteen cents for articles furnished the Legislature; to Hugh McAlear, four dollars and eighty-six cents, for articles furnished the Legislature; to Adams & Co. Express, five dollars and sixty cents for freight on Stationery, &c.; to Tyler Davis, four dollars for freight on Stationery; to Erasmus West, three dollars and sixty-two cents, for articles furnished the Legislature; to G. & L. Markell & Co., two dollars and forty cents for articles furnished the State Library; to H. C. Shipley, one dollar and fifty cents for articles furnished the Committee on Claims; to A. H. Hager, thirty six dollars for services as porter to the State Library; to H. C.
