SECTION. 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the State of to pay. Maryland, upon the warrant of the Comptroller, pay to Allen G. Quynn, the sum of thirty-eight dollars for articles furnished the troops protecting Frederick Barracks under order of the Governor.

SEC. 2. Be it enacted, That this act take effect In force. from and after the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 26.

AN ACT for the relief of the Baltimore and Liber-Passed June ty Turnpike Company.

Passed June 10, 1861.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the subscriptions to the capital stock of the Baltimore and Liberty Turnpike Company received by any one or two of said company, shall be as valid and legal, as if the same had been received by three of said company.
