RATES OF POSTAGE.

All distances under 30 miles, 6 cents—over 30 and under 80, 10 cents—over 80, and under 150, 12½ cents—over 150, and under 400, 18½ cents—over 400, 25 cents. Letters consisting of 2 pieces, double—3 pieces, treble—4 pieces, or one piece, if it weighs an ounce, quadruple the foregoing rates. Letters for Foreign Ports, to go by ship or otherwise must have the American inland postage paid thereon.
