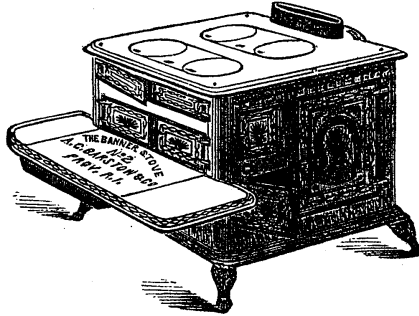

**BANNER STOVE,**

Which took the highest premium at the Fair of the Maryland Institute in 1852, (the above cut is a correct representation,) and is designed to meet the wants of that class of families that wish to burn coal part of the year, and wood the balance of the time. It has a large square oven, which bakes with an equal heat on every part. It has a Lever Grate, the shank of which projects through the outside of the Stove, which enables the cook to clear the Grate without any dust coming into the room. The Broiling is done to perfection, by closing the draft and sliding the Gridiron through small doors over the fire, leaving the trough outside, so that it does not burn the grease or leave any smell in the room.
