tion, with free ingress, egress and regress to and from the same, to them and their successors forever.

Sec. 5. And be it enacted, That any mortgage Title to vest or deed of the said lot or land executed by the said in purchaser, corporation of lodge, if signed by the presiding officer and Secretary thereof, with the corporate seal attached, and acknowledged according to existing laws, shall vest in or convey to the mortgagee or mortgagees, purchaser or purchasers, a valid lien or an indefeasable title as the case may be, against all parties claiming under and by virtue of the said deed of said Ellis and wife, and the articles of association aforesaid.

Sec. 6. And be it enacted, That nothing herein Banking procontained shall authorize the said lodge to issue any note, scrip or evidence of debt to be used as currency.

Sec. 7. And be it enacted, That this act shall Reservation. at all time be subject to amendments, alterations or repeal at the pleasure of the Legislature.

Sec. 8. And be it enacted, That this act shall In force. go into force and be deemed a law from the date fo its passage.

CHAPTER 108.
