

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the President, Managers and Company of the Baltimore and Yorktown Turnpike Road be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to charge and collect from each passenger in any car or vehicle on said railway, not more than thirty cents fare, as toll for the whole distance between the city limits and Towson town, and not more than six cents local fare for each mile or fraction thereof each way-passenger may travel on any portion of the railway of the said company. Rates of fare.

Sec. 2. *And be it further enacted,* That so much of the original and supplemental acts herein referred to, as are inconsistent with the provisions of this act, be and the same are hereby repealed. Repealed.

Sec. 3. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the day of its passage. In force.

CHAPTER 116.

AN ACT to appropriate a sum of money to the Home of the Friendless. Passed March 20, 1865.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Comptroller of the Treasury be and he is hereby authorized and required to draw his warrant on the Treasurer of the State for the sum of one thousand dollars in favor of the Home of the Friendless. Authorized to issue warrant.

Sec. 2. *Be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect and be in force from the date of its passage. In force.
