CHAPTER 124.

AN ACT to enable qualified voters of this State, Passed March 23, 1865. in the military service of the United States or this State to exercise the right of suffrage, and to add the following sections providing therefor to the thirty-fifth Article of the Code of Public General Laws, title Elections:

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly ed. of Maryland, That that the following sections be added to the thirty-fifth Article of the Code of Public General Laws:

Sections add-

2. That whenever any of the qualified voters of Right of sufthis State shall be in the military service of the United States or this State, and as such be absent from the city of Baltimore or the county of their residence on the days appointed by law for holding State, County, Congressional or Presidential elections within this State, or on the days appointed by the proper authority for holding special elections to fill vacancies, such qualified voters shall be entitled at such time to exercise the right of suffrage as fully as if they were present at their usual places of voting.

3. That a poll shall be opened in each regiment or company at the quarters of the commanding opened. officer of said regiment or company, and all duly qualified electors of this State, belonging to such regiment or company, who shall be on duty or in hospital at or near such quarters on the day of election may vote at such poll.

4. That such polls shall be opened at nine o'clock in the morning and closed at five o'clock at 9 o'clock. in the afternoon; provided, nevertheless, that such Proviso. election may be held or polls opened for the reception of the votes of the duly qualified electors at any time within five days thereafter, if from the emergencies or duties of the service, such electors cannot exercise their right of suffrage on the day appointed by law for any general election in this State.
