

them in the Circuit Courts for the several counties, and the Superior and Common Pleas Courts of Baltimore city, and the Sheriff's fees, and all costs which have been incurred by the State in the prosecution of said claims, the State thereby to be released from any commissions and costs."

Sec. 2. *And be it further enacted*, That the Comptroller, upon the payment of the principal due on the aforesaid claims as hereinbefore provided, and all costs, and upon being satisfied that the commissions to the State's Attorneys and the Sheriff's fees have been paid as hereinbefore required, shall have the judgments which have been recorded against the parties or their sureties entered "satisfied," and the accounts in the Comptroller's office against any of said parties complying with the conditions herein prescribed, shall be balanced and entered adjusted.

## CHAPTER 127.

AN ACT to amend and re-enact section one hundred and six of Article eighty-one of the Code of Public General Laws entitled, "Revenue and Taxes," and relating to the tax on Executors and Administrator's commissions.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That section one hundred and six of Article eighty-one of the Code of Public General Laws entitled, "Revenue and Taxes," and relating to the tax on executors and administrators commissions, be and the same hereby is amended and re-enacted so as to read as follows:
