AN ACT to release certain claims of the State against Collectors, Sheriffs and others, to discontinue the suits instituted for the recovery thereof.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, upon the recommendation of the Comptroller of the Treasury and of the Treasurer*, That the following claims due from Collectors and Sheriffs, now standing on the books of the Treasurer, be and the same are hereby released, and all suits instituted for the recovery thereof, be and the same are hereby directed to be discontinued, namely, claims against James Twigg, Collector of State taxes in Allegany county, for eighteen hundred and forty-six, for five hundred and seven dollars and eighty-six cents; claims against Benjamin T. Pindle, Collector of State taxes in Anne Arundel county, for eighteen hundred and forty-one and eighteen hundred and forty-two, for two thousand three hundred and eighteen dollars and ninety-five cents; claim against Benjamin T. Pindle, Sheriff of Anne Arundel county for eighteen hundred and forty-four, for four hundred and two dollars and sixty-three cents; claim against John H. Naff, late auctioneer in Baltimore city, for two hundred and forty-three dollars and seventy-six cents; claim against John J. Gross, late auctioneer in Baltimore city, for two hundred and twenty-three dollars and sixty-two cents; claim against Harrison Dawes, late auctioneer in Baltimore city, for one hundred dollars and thirteen cents; claim
