Waters, Sheriff of Montgomery county, in eighteen hundred and thirty-four, for sixteen dollars and ninety-one cents; claim against Thomas F. W. Vinson, Sheriff of Montgomery county, in eighteen hundred and forty-two and eighteen hundred and forty-three, for eighty-six dollars and twenty-five cents; claim against Daniel H. ## CHAPTER 196.

AN ACT to provide for regulating the relation of Creditor and Debtor between the State and the Susquehanna and Tide Water Canal Companies. Passed March 23, 1865.
