March 6, 1865.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the State Librarian be and he is hereby authorized and directed to subscribe in the name of the State, for two hundred copies of a collection of English Statutes, which existed at the time of the first emigration of the people of Maryland, and which by experience have been found applicable to their local and other circumstances, and of such others as have since been made in England or Great Britain, and have been introduced, used and practised by the courts of law or equity, and which were therefore proper to be incorporated
