CHAPTER 172.

Passed Mar. 4, 1864. AN ACT to repeal an act of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed the ninth day of March, eighteen hundred and sixty, chapter two hundred and fifteen, entitled, "An act to amend the third Article of the Code of Public Local Laws, by adding thereto certain sections, vesting the County Commissioners of Baltimore county with powers to lay out a certain road, from Catonsville to the Rolling Road," and to substitute the following sections in lieu thereof.

Repealed. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the act of General Assembly of Maryland, passed the ninth day of March, eighteen hundred and sixty, chapter two hundred and fifteen, entitled, "An act to amend the third Article of the Code of Public Local Laws, by adding thereto certain sections, vesting the County Commissioners of Baltimore county with powers to lay out a certain road from Catonsville to the Rolling road," be and the same is hereby repealed.

Authorized to lay out public road.

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the County Commissioners of Baltimore county shall and are hereby authorized to condemn and lay out a public road, from Catonsville, in Baltimore county, to the Rolling road, of a width less than thirty feet, in the same manner in every respect as if said road
