Sec. 2. *And be it further enacted*, That the Trustees of Primary School District number fifty-nine, of Frederick county, shall be and they are hereby authorized to erect suitable buildings on said land, to be used for the purposes of a Primary School and for such other purposes as may be deemed necessary for the promotion of education of youth, in conformity with an act entitled, An Act to provide for the public instruction of youth in primary schools throughout this State, passed at December session, eighteen hundred and twenty-five, chapter one hundred and sixty-two. ## CHAPTER 204.

AN ACT to add new sections to Article twelve of the Code of Public Local Laws of Harford county, relating to fences. Passed Mar.  
7, 1864.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the following sections relating to fences be added to Article twelve of the Code of Public Local Laws, entitled, "Harford County," and be arranged under the head of "Fences" in said Article: Sections added

SECTION 1. All division fences between the lands of different proprietors in Harford county, which may be necessary for their mutual protection, shall be made and repaired at the joint and equal expense of the parties interested. Division fences

Sec. 2. All such joint division fences, if made of post and rails or plank, shall be four feet and a half high; all worm fences shall be five feet high, made of good and sound rails, staked and ridged and substantially built. Height of fence
