SECTION 1. *Therefore, be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the Comptroller of the State is hereby ordered and directed to refund to the said John Harrison, Collector of the State Tax as aforesaid, the said sum of three hundred dollars.

Sec. 2. *Be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from and after the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 220.

Passed Mar.
9, 1864.

AN ACT to provide for the presentation of Regimental Flags to the Maryland Regiments in the service of the United States.

Governor di-
rected to pro-
cure flags.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the Governor is hereby directed to procure Regimental Flags and present the same in such manner and with such direction as he may see fit, as to the particular Regiments; to such Maryland Regiments, Batteries or Battalions, as have borne or may hereafter bear a distinguished part in any of the battles of the War.

Sum appro-
priated.

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the sum of two thousand five hundred dollars, or so much thereof as the Governor may deem necessary, is hereby appropriated to carry out this act, and the Comptroller shall draw his warrant for such sum, to the order of the Governor, in such amounts as the Governor may request.

In force.

Sec. 3. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from its passage.
