

CHAPTER 275.

AN ACT to allow John T. Diffenbaugh, Jacob Campbell and Stephen R. Gore, late Collectors of State and county taxes of Carroll county, further time to complete their collections. Passed Mar. 7, 1864.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That John T. Diffenbaugh, late Collector of State and county taxes for the years eighteen hundred and fifty-eight and eighteen hundred and fifty-nine, for Carroll county, and Jacob Campbell, late Collector of State and county taxes for eighteen hundred and sixty and eighteen hundred and sixty-one, and Stephen R. Gore, Collector of State and county taxes for the years eighteen hundred and fifty-four, eighteen hundred and fifty-five, eighteen hundred and fifty-six, and eighteen hundred and fifty-seven of the county aforesaid, be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to collect all taxes or balances of taxes now remaining uncollected by them in the county aforesaid, in the same manner and with the same power and privilege as are allowed by existing laws in such cases made and provided; *provided*, it shall be the duty of the said John T. Diffenbaugh, Jacob Campbell and Stephen R. Gore, before they proceed to execute the property of any person or persons for taxes in virtue of this act, to deliver to such person or persons chargeable with the same at least thirty days previous to the levying of such execution a fair account, in writing, of the taxes demanded of him, her, or them, and an affidavit thereto annexed that they have not, directly or indirectly, received any part thereof, or any security or satisfaction for the same more than the credit given, to the best of their knowledge. Time extend ed.

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall not continue in force more than two years from the date of its passage. Proviso.

Sec. 3. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from its passage. Limited.
