

CHAPTER 299.

AN ACT to authorize the Commissioners of Charles county to levy a sum of money to open and straighten Port Tobacco Run.

Passed Mar.
8, 1864.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the County Commissioners for Charles county, be and they are hereby authorized and empowered, at their discretion, to levy on the taxable property of said county, a sum of money not to exceed six hundred dollars, to be expended, or so much of it as shall be necessary to the opening and straightning of a stream, at Port Tobacco, known by the name of Port Tobacco Run; and,

Sec. 2. *Be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
