

or owners of any land over or through which the road shall be located by the said Commissioners, it shall be lawful for the said Company to cause any Justice of the Peace for Baltimore city to issue his warrant to the Sheriff directing him to summon twelve impartial Jurors, to meet on said land on a day to be therein named, to assess the damages sustained by said owner or owners, by reason of said road passing through said land, which inquisition shall be returned to the Clerk's office, and either party shall have the right to appeal to the Circuit Court for Baltimore county from the verdict or finding of said Jury, within sixty days from the finding of said verdict.

Sec. 12. *And be it enacted*, That said company shall not exercise any banking powers or issue any paper to be used as currency. Not to exercise banking privileges.

Sec. 13. *And be it enacted*, That the Legislature may amend or annul this act at pleasure. May amend or annul.

Sec. 14. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage. In force.

CHAPTER 350.

AN ACT to appropriate certain sums of money to pay the claims of Frederick Sasscer, Clerk of the Circuit Court for Prince George's county, and Daniel R. Dyer, former Sheriff of said county. Passed Mar. 10, 1864.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the Comptroller be and he is hereby authorized and directed to issue his warrant to the Treasurer requiring him to pay to Frederick Sasscer, Clerk of the Circuit Court for Prince George's county, the sum of one hundred and six dollars and seventy cents, for fees due in certain State cases, and to Daniel R. Dyer, former Sheriff of said County, the sum of thirty-seven Authorized to pay.
