L. Brauns & Company, Leddon & Ash, A. Schumaker & Company, N. E. Berry, J. G. Lantz, and R. B. Porter & Son, against the State Tobacco Warehouse number two, upon satisfactory evidence being furnished the Comptroller that their several accounts are correct and just; to J. H. Hynes, late Sheriff of Baltimore county, seventy-two dollars and twenty-two cents, for moneys paid in error.
