Bowen, late Sheriff of Calvert county, or order, two dollars and seventy cents, for fees due from the State; to pay James E. Tate, or order, twenty-five dollars and forty-four cents, for articles furnished E. M. Shipley, late Librarian; to pay James G. Reddan, late Sheriff of Caroline county, or order, thirteen dollars and twenty cents, for fees due from the State.

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

## CHAPTER 388.

Passed Mar. 10, 1864. AN ACT to incorporate a Company to make a Turnpike Road in Washington county, to be styled the Marsh Turnpike Company.

Incorporated. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That a company be and the same is hereby incorporated under the name and style of the "Marsh Turnpike Company," and by that name shall have succession and be capable by law to hold and dispose of real and personal property, by deed or otherwise, to sue and be sued, plead and impleaded, answer and defend and be answered and defended, in Courts of Law or Equity, or in any other place whatsoever, to make, have and use a common seal, and the same to change or renew at pleasure, and generally to do every other act or thing necessary to carry into effect the provisions of this act, or any of them.
