

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the boundaries of said election district shall be as follow: beginning at the bridge on the main branch of the Nanticoke river, at Federalsburg, thence with the county road that separates Dorchester from Caroline county, to Hunting Creek, thence with said creek to Choptank river, thence with said river to Blink Horn Creek, thence with said creek to its head or until its intersects the county road leading from Cabin Creek to Hunting Creek, thence with the Manor line to Washington Chapel, thence with the aforesaid line and road that divides the lands of Nathan Williams from Thomas A. Trice, Nichols Wright from Stephen Andrews and James M. Hurlock, thence following the plain road leading to Henry D. Wright's Mill and branch, thence with said branch to the main branch of the Nanticoke river, thence with said river to the mouth of Miles branch, thence with said branch to the county road leading from Johnson's Cross Roads to Federalsburg, thence with said county road to the place of beginning.

CHAPTER 169.

AN ACT to authorize the Comptroller to adjust and settle the accounts of the Inspectors of Grain in the city of Baltimore.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the Comptroller of the Treasury be and he is hereby authorized and directed to adjust and settle the accounts of the Inspectors of Grain in the city of Baltimore, in accordance with the provisions of the grain law as laid down in the Code of Public Local Laws, and issue his warrant upon the Treasurer for such sum as may be found due to each Inspector, such sum not to exceed the compensation limited by the section three
