

CHAPTER 199.

Passed March 5, 1862. AN ACT to amend section three hundred and fifty-four of Article four of the Code of Public Local Laws, for the city of Baltimore, relating to Gaugers of Casks and Inspectors of Domestic Distilled Liquors.

Amended. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That section three hundred and fifty-four of Article four of the Code of Public Local Laws for the city of Baltimore, relating to Gaugers of Casks and Inspectors of Domestic Distilled Liquors, be amended and re-enacted so as to read as follows :

Gaugers of Casks and Inspectors of Domestic Distilled Liquors. 354. The Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, shall biennially appoint four Gaugers of Casks and Inspectors of Domestic Distilled Liquors, who, before they proceed to act as such, shall apply to the Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas of Baltimore city, and on paying each the sum of one hundred dollars to said Clerk, shall be entitled to receive a license to act as Gauger of Casks and Inspectors of Liquors for the term of two years from the date thereof.

In force. Sec. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 200.

Passed March 10, 1862. AN ACT to compensate William Segafoose, late Sheriff of Carroll county, for services rendered under a requisition of the Governor.

Treasurer authorized to pay. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and directed to pay, upon the warrant of the Comptroller, to William Segafoose, or order, the sum of fifty dollars, for services rendered under a requisition of the Governor.

In force. Sec 2. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from its passage.
