

CHAPTER 201.

AN ACT to amend the fifteen section of Article ninety of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to Supervisors of Roads. Passed March 7, 1862.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That section fifteen of Article ninety of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to Supervisors of Roads, be and the same is hereby repealed and the following enacted as a substitute therefor: Repealed.

Sec. 15. Every Supervisor shall be liable to be presented by the Grand Jury of his county, for any neglect of duty or malfeasance in office, and shall upon conviction thereof before the Circuit Court of his county, be fined in each case not less than five or more than twenty-five dollars in the discretion of the Court; *provided*, that the Road Supervisors in those counties where the County Commissioners make the appropriation and levy for roads in advance of the expenditure by the Supervisors shall not be required or authorized to expend in the repair of roads within their respective districts, a larger sum per mile than shall have been levied by the County Commissioners for that purpose. Road Supervisor liable to presentment for malfeasance in office.

And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage. Proviso. In force.

CHAPTER 202.

AN ACT to allow Robert Bell, late Sheriff and Collector of State and county taxes for Dorchester county, further time to complete his collections. Passed March 7, 1862.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Robert Bell, late Sheriff and Collector of State and county taxes for Dorchester county, be and he is hereby allowed until the Empowered to collect.
