Resolved by the Senate and House of Delegates of Maryland, That the State of Maryland hereby declares its intention to assume and pay its quota of the Direct Tax imposed by the Act of Congress of August sixth, eighteen hundred and sixty-one; and the Governor is requested to communicate this resolution to the Secretary of the Treasury of the United States.
