board shall proceed to consider the same, and if the facts are found as above stated the said teacher shall be placed on a list, a record of which shall be kept by the said board, to be known as the "Teachers' Retired List," and every person so placed on said retired list shall be entitled to receive a pension from the State of two hundred dollars per annum, to be paid quarterly by the Treasurer of the State Board of Education, so long as such pensioner is without other means of comfortable support, and the State Board of Education may in extraordinary cases waive the age limit as herein provided; provided, however, the applicant has all the other qualifications as provided herein. The Treasurer of the State Board of Education shall on or before the twentieth day of the month of September. December. March and June of each year, certify to the Comptroller the sum of money necessary for the payment of said pensions for the current quarter as provided by this Section, and the Comptroller shall, on or before the first day of the months of October, January, April and July issue his warrant on the Treasurer of the State in favor of the Treasurer of the State Board of Education for the amount so certified. That the sum of thirty-four thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated annually out of any moneys in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to carry into effect the provisions of this Act.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 737.

An Act to authorize the County Commissioners of Worcester County to sell or lease to the Maryland Agricultural College the almshouse farm for demonstration work.

Whereas, Worcester County owns one of the best farms in the State adapted for growing of fruits, vegetables and farm crops, it being a sandy loam with red clay sub-soil, well drained and located near the centre of the County, on the main State highway, within easy access to all the people of the County, especially when the State road system is completed, it being two and a half miles from Snow Hill, the County Seat, fourteen miles from Pocomoke City and about fourteen miles from Berlin, and
