nuisances within the limits of said City; for the purpose of carrying out the aforegoing powers, the Mayor and Council may pass any and all ordinances and by-laws from time to time deemed necessary, and may enforce and insure the observance of such by-laws and ordinances in addition to the usual action of debt or such other civil remedies as may exist in such cases by law for the recovery of fees, fines and penalties thereto affixed, they may affix thereto reasonable penalty for default of payment of any fine and cost imposed for a violation of any ordinance or by-law.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
