

SEC. 2. Be it further enacted, That all laws and parts of laws inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed, otherwise to remain in full force and effect.

SEC. 3. *Be it further enacted,* That this Act shall take effect from the first day of January, 1915.

CHAPTER 786.

AN ACT to regulate the practice of osteopathy in the State of Maryland; to provide for the establishment of a State Board of Osteopathic Examiners; to define the powers and duties of said Board of Osteopathic Examiners; to provide for the examining and licensing of osteopaths in this State; and to provide penalties for the violation of this Act.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Delegates of the General Assembly of Maryland,* That there shall be established a Board of Osteopathic Examiners for the State of Maryland. The Board shall consist of five members, and each of said members shall serve for a term of three years from the first day of June, next after his appointment, or until his successor is appointed, with the exception of those first appointed, who shall serve as follows: namely, two for one year, two for two years, and one for three years, from the first day of June, Anno Domini one thousand nine hundred and fourteen. Each member of the said board shall be a graduate of a legally incorporated and reputable college of osteopathy and shall have been licensed to practice osteopathy under the laws of this State, excepting in the case of the first board, which shall be appointed as provided for in Section three,—and shall not be in any manner financially interested in, or connected with the faculty or management of any osteopathic school or college, and shall have been engaged in the practice of osteopathy in this State for a period of at least three years.

SEC. 2. The Governor shall appoint the members of said Board of Examiners, from a full list of the members in good standing of the Maryland Osteopathic Association who are eligible for appointment upon said Board of Osteopathic Examiners; which list shall, on or before the first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and annually thereafter, be transmitted to the Governor, under the seal and signed by the President and
