SEC. 17. Be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 855.

- An Act to declare the sanction and consent of the General Assembly of Maryland to sundry gifts, bequests and devises contained in the last wills and testaments of certain persons, late of the State of Maryland, deceased, and also to certain gifts, grants, sales, leases and deeds made by various persons in this State to and for the use and benefit of sundry ministerial persons, religious corporations, denominations, or sects, and to certain charitable institutions.
- Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the sanction and consent of the General Assembly of Maryland, be and the same are hereby declared, given and granted to the following gifts, bequests, devises, grants, sales, leases and deeds to and for the use and benefit of certain ministerial persons, religious corporations, denominations or sects, and to certain charitable institutions as herein set forth.
- 1. To the bequest of \$300.00 to the Deer Creek Monthly Meeting of Friends and to the bequest of \$100.00 to the Trustees of the Old Friends' Graveyard at Darlington, Harford County, in the State of Maryland, contained in the last will and testament of Ephraim Hopkins, late of Harford County, deceased.
- 2. To the bequest of \$1,000.00 to Victor Monroe Cushwa, David Kriegh Cushwa and Margaret Eva Cullen, executors under the last will and testament of Victor Cushwa, late of Washington County, deceased, with direction to said executors to pay, at such times and in such amounts as they deem best, said sum of \$1,000.00 to Saint Augustine's Catholic Church, of Williamsport, to be appropriated to the payment of the debt of said church, if any, or to the support of the pastor and repairs of the church.
- 3. To the bequest of \$400.00 to the Vestry of All Saints Parish in Frederick County, Maryland, contained in the will of the late B. Kurtz Englebrecht, recorded in the office of the Register of Wills of Frederick County, in Liber S. D. T. No. 1, folios 122 and 123.
