

Hancock and the question of said bond issue may again be submitted to the voters of Hancock, qualified as provided in this Section of this Act, in the manner provided in this Section of this Act, the result of which new election to have the same force and effect as is herein provided for the election hereinabove first mentioned. The Burgess and Commissioners of Hancock shall pay all the expenses of said election, or elections, and for each such election, the Judges and Clerk officiating thereat shall receive the sum of Two Dollars each.

The provisions of the foregoing Sections 241-X, 241-Y and 241-Z are further made subject to the condition that if bonds to the amount of Thirty Thousand Dollars be issued under the provisions of Chapter 33 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland of the year 1910, then no additional bonds shall be issued under the provisions of said foregoing Sections 241-X, 241-Y and 241-Z.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
