forthwith the said copy of the appraisement to the State Tax Commission of Maryland, and he shall note thereon whether or not the value placed on the property by the appraisers is or is not a proper one. Should the State Tax Commission of Maryland believe that the appraisement is erroneous, authority is hereby conferred upon it, to set the matter for hearing, at a time not more than ten days after the return to it of the copy of the appraisement by the local supervisor, and after hearing they may make such decision as the facts in the case may warrant, and the appraisers shall be bound thereby, and may be directed by the State Tax Commission to make any alteration or changes in their appraisement as the said State Tax Commission may have determined. The appraisers appointed in and for Baltimore City shall not be required to give a copy of any appraisement to the local supervisor, but the State Tax Commission or its agents may at all times investigate any appraisement, and if they deem the same erroneous, they may direct a hearing as in the case of appraisements by county appraisers.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That this Act shall take effect June 1st, 1916.

## CHAPTER 670.

An Act to provide for the partial support of mothers whose husbands are dead, when such mothers have children under fourteen (14) years of age, and are residents of the City of Baltimore and State of Maryland, and of the County in which application for relief is made. And, also to provide for visitation, care and supervision of the family within the State of Maryland for whose benefit such support is provided and to promote home life for dependent children under the guidance and protection of the mother. And, also as to the Administration of this Act, amount of Payment, Eligibility, Investigation, Penalties and Reports. And, also providing for the appointment of a Board of three members in Baltimore City, to be known as the Board for Mothers' Relief for Baltimore City, or for carrying out the provisions of this Act by the Board of Supervisors of City Charities of Baltimore City, and authorizing the County
