

CHAPTER 88.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact with amendment Section 73 of Article 7 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, title "Carroll County," sub-title "Manchester," as amended by Chapter 262 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, nineteen hundred and eight, authorizing the Mayor and Common Council of the town of Manchester, to levy a tax not to exceed thirty cents on the one hundred dollars of assessed value of property within the corporate limits of said town of Manchester, with certain exceptions, for the improvement and management of said town and other corporate purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Section 73 of Article 7 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, title "Carroll County," sub-title "Manchester," as amended by Chapter 262 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, Nineteen Hundred and Eight, be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted with amendment so as to read as follows:

Section 73. All property, whether real, personal or mixed, within said corporate limits, except that occupied as Churches, Schools and the property owned by Lebanon Lodge, No. 175, A. F. & A. M., and the property owned by Daniel and Jacob Lodge, No. 23, I. O. O. F., shall be subject to such taxes and charges as may be deemed necessary by said Mayor and Common Council, to support and maintain the expenses which may be at any time incurred in the improvement and management of said town, and for other corporate purposes, not exceeding thirty cents on the hundred dollars of the assessed value of all property within the corporate limits of said town, now liable to assessment and taxation for State and County taxation under the laws of this State, except as above exempt.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That before this Act shall become operative, to authorize said taxation the question shall be submitted to the qualified voters of Manchester, at the regular general municipal election to be held next after the passage of this Bill, for approval or rejection by such qualified voters and in pursuance of the provisions of an ordinance to be passed therefor, of which election and the fact that the question is to be submitted to the voters, notice shall be given for at least ten days previous to such election, posted in five or more public places in said town, explaining to the qualified voters the
