

Section 507, shall, on conviction thereof before a justice of the peace, be fined not less than fifty dollars and not more than one hundred dollars, for each and every violation thereof; one-half of said fine to be paid to the informer, and the other half to the school commissioners of the county in which said offense may be committed, for school purposes.

512. The clerk of the Circuit Court who shall issue a license, in compliance with the requirements of Section 507, shall be entitled to charge and receive seventy-five cents for issuing the same; and each of the clerks of the said circuit courts shall keep a register of the name and residences of the persons to whom he shall issue licenses, also the name and number of each sink-box and sneak-boat, for the use of which he may issue a license, and also a correct account of the sum of money paid by each person receiving a license; and the official bond of said clerks shall be liable, respectively, for the monies received by them for such licenses.

513. The board of special police, appointed by Section 516, are constituted officers of this State, for the purpose of enforcing the provisions of Sections 498-522, inclusive, by arresting and taking before any judge of any circuit court or any justice of the peace, all persons who may be engaged in violating, or who may have violated any of the provisions of said sections, and of seizing any sink-boat, sneak-boat or vessel, or craft of any description engaged in violating, or which may have been used in violating the same; and every person in whose use or possession a gun may be found, on the waters aforesaid, of a larger size than is allowed and described in Section 504, shall be deemed guilty of a violation thereof, and shall be fined not less than one hundred dollars, and shall also forfeit such unlawful gun found in his possession.

514. Upon information being given, under oath, to any justice of the peace of either Harford or Cecil County, of any violation of any of the provisions of Sections 498-522, inclusive, the justice of the peace shall issue his warrant for the arrest of the offender, and the seizure of all sink boxes, sneak-boats, vessels, or other crafts, used or employed in such violation, together with all tackle, apparel and other property on board, which warrant shall be directed to the sheriff or any constable of the county, or to one or more of the special police appointed under the provisions of Section 516; and any person resisting an officer, or other person authorized to make arrests and seizures under said sections, shall be guilty of a misde-
