AND WHEREAS, in compliance with said Section 54 of Article III of the Constitution of Maryland, and in further compliance with Section 11 of said Chapter 437 of the Acts of 1914, said Act of the General Assembly of Maryland, as embraced in said Chapter 437 of the Acts of 1914, was published for two months in the newspapers published in said Calvert County preceding the election of members of the House of Delegates held on the 2nd day of November, 1915;

THEREFORE,

*Be it resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the said Act of the General Assembly of Maryland, as embraced in Chapter 437 of the Acts of 1914, and as above set forth, be and the same is hereby approved and ratified.*
