- B. Provisions for limited periods of training for such men as non-commissioned or commissioned officers in the Militia of this State.
- C. Organization of said Military Reserve and methods by which it might be mustered as active militia in case of need.
- D. The cost to the State of any plan recommended by the Board or Commission.

The Board or Commission is authorized, in its discretion, to consider any related matter whether or not the same is particularly mentioned in this Act. The members of the Board or Commission shall serve without pay, and the Board or Commission shall report to the present General Assembly, if possible, with such recommendations for legislation as the Board or Commission may deem advisable within thirty days after its appointment.
