- SEC. 3. And be it further enacted, That the Commission shall have the power to arrange the organization and equipment of the survey in such manner as may seem to it best, employ and fix the compensation of investigators and other employees required for the efficient conduct of the work, and call to its assistance any expert help that may be available, either from public or private foundations. It shall have power to purchase books, maps, and other materials required, to prepare and print blanks for information or guidance of its work, and in general to make any provisions for the work that may be necessary.
- Sec. 4. And be it further enacted, That the Commission shall have the use of the office and the assistance of the members of the State Board of Education, the State Superintendent of Schools, their assistants and employees, so far as this may be necessary; they shall have free access to all public records necessary to the carrying out of the duties herein prescribed; and all officers, teachers or employees connected with the public school system of the State of Maryland, or with any educational institution receiving aid from the State of Maryland, shall give such assistance to the Commission as may be required of it.
- Sec. 5. And be it further enacted, That the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) be, and the same is hereby appropriated, out of any monies in the State Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to be paid by the Treasurer of Maryland on the warrant of the Comptroller on or before July 1, 1916, to such person as the Commission may designate as its treasurer.
- SEC. 6. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect on June 1, 1916.
