CHAPTER 399.

An Act, to further protect the game of the State by creating a new section of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland Article 99, Title "Wild Fowl—Birds and Game," to be known as section 73.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That a new section to be known as section 73, be added to the Code of Public General Laws, Article 99, said section to read as follows:

Section 73. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That there be a closed season on Elk and Deer within the State of Maryland for a period of six years beginning from June first, 1916. Any person convicted, before any justice of the peace of Maryland, of violation of this statute shall be fined not less that \$25.00 nor more than \$100.00, for each and every offense. One half of the fine in such case shall go to the informer or officer causing the arrest and conviction, unless such officer be a salaried game warden, and the other half of said fine shall go to the credit of the State Game Protection Fund for the protection and propagation of Game. If the arrest and conviction be effected by a salaried game warden, the entire fine recovered shall go to the State Game Protection Fund.

SEC. 2. Be it further enacted, That all laws or parts of laws inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, and that this Act shall take effect from the first day of June 1916.
