have a vestry, composed of members of both said congregations; and also so much of said act as relates to the money collected, and the application of the same, be and the same is hereby repealed.

## CHAPTER 101.

An act for the relief of Joseph Wood, former Sh. riff of Passed Mar. 22, Calvert County. 1837.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Authorised to Maryland, That Joseph Wood, former Sheriff of Calcollect, vert county, be and he is hereby authorised to collect, until the first day of January, eighteen hundred and thirty-eight, all fines. forfeitures, americaments, officers' fees, or public dues, which were placed in his hands for collection, and all legal fees made by him while sheriff, and which have not been collected, in the same manner as he could or might have done within the time limited by law.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted. That the said Joseph Wood Accounts to be before he proceeds to execute the body or property of any person or persons, for fees, forfeitures, amerciaments, officers' fees, or public dues, by the authority of this act, shall deliver, or cause to be delivered, to such person or persons chargeable with the same, or left at their houses, at least thirty days previous to serving or levying such execution, an account of the sum demanded of him, her or them, which shall contain the specific items charged, with an affidavit an-Affidavit requinexed thereto, that he hath not, nor hath any other person or persons acting under him whilst sheriff, nor since, received any part thereof, or satisfaction for the same, to the best of his knowledge and belief; provided, that if any person, against whom there is a claim Bar by said Wood aforesaid, shall make affidavit before any Justice of the Peace of said county, that he or she believes the same to be unjust, or that the same had been paid at any previous time, it shall forever bar such claim; and provided, that nothing in this act shall Exemption be construed to affect the estate of any deceased person.
