

## CHAPTER 104.

CHAP. 105.

*An act to authorise John A. Pye, and James B. Pye, of Charles County, to bring into this State certain Negroes therein named.* Passed Mar. 1,  
1837.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* Permission granted  
That from and after the passage of this act, it shall and may be lawful for John A. Pye, to bring into this State, Negroes Alfred, Harry, Jane and Vincent, slaves for life, and the property of the said John A. Pye, and for James B. Pye, to bring into this State, negro John, a slave for life, and the property of him the said James B. Pye; provided they and each of them Proviso shall comply with the last provision of the fourth section of the act of Assembly passed December session eighteen hundred and thirty one. chapter three hundred and twenty three, and also with the requisitions of the act passed at December session, eighteen hundred and thirty three, chapter eighty seven.

## CHAPTER 105.

*A supplement to an act, entitled, an act, for the preservation of Wild Fowl, in the Potomac River and its tributary streams, passed at December Session, eighteen hundred and thirty-two, chapter one hundred and thirty-four, and extending the provisions of this and the original act to the Patuxent River.* Passed Mar. 1,  
1836.

**SECTION 1.** *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* Warrant to issue That from and after the first of October next, in all cases of a violation of the provisions of the act to which this is a supplement, it shall be the duty of such justice of the peace of this State as shall be applied to for that purpose, forthwith to issue a warrant in the name of the State of Maryland, against any person charged with the violation of said act, in the same manner as State warrants are now issued; *provided,* Oath required that the party applying for such warrant shall make oath before such justice that he is informed and believes that the person so charged has been guilty of the violation of said act.
