And be it enacted, That the Burgesses and Pavemen Commissioners aforesaid, shall cause the footway of said town to be graded so that the citizens who may wish to pave the same can see where such paving shall be made, and that said Burgesses and Commissioners shall have power to make all such by-law, regulations, By laws. and ordinances as from time to time they may deem wise, equitable and expedient for the comfort, health, convenience, and prosperity of the said town, and its inhabitants; for the prevention or removal of nuisances.
