CHAPTER 156.

CRAP. 157

A supplement to the act, entitled, an act concerning Passed Max. 7, Crimes and Punishments, passed at November session, eighteen hundred and nine, chapter one hundred and thirty-cipil.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Shaving the Maryland, That from and after the passage of this act beed forbid it shall not be lawful to shave the lead of any prisoner or prisoners who are now, or shall hereafter be confined in the Maryland Ponitentiary.

SEC. 2. And be it further enacted. That it shall be the Sennece reduty of the several county courts of this State, and the stricted city court of Baltimore, in sentencing convicts to the penitentiary, to sentence them for such a period as will expire between the first day of April and the last Tearging between the first day of April and the last Tearging the country of the second price of the country of the second price of the country notwith standing.

SEC. S. And be it enacted, That all acts or parts of Repeal acts contrary to, or inconsistent with the provisions of this act, be, and the same are hereby repealed.

CHAPTER 157.

A. act for the benefit of the Sheriff of Queen Ann's Passed Mar. 9, County.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, 25 conts par day That in lieu of the sum now allowed by law for furishing victuals to debtors confined in jail, it shall and may be lawful for the Sheriffor Queen Ann's county to ask, demand, and receive the sum of twenty five cents per day for each and every person that may be confined in the jail of said county for debt, or who shall be committed under the insolvent laws of this State, or for want of special bail, the said sum to be paid in the manner now prescribed by law.
